Important Notice Regarding Chipping Program for 2021 Change in Scheduling Process

I have just received information on the slash chipping and removal program for 2021. This year

scheduling will be a bit different as the program is being coordinated through the combined Elk Creek and Inter-Canyon fire departments.

We will not have a set date for the entire neighborhood. Each homeowner needs to sign up via the link below providing their address and confirming geographic location. Based upon that info the combined Elk Creek/Inter-Canyon District will schedule chipping dates by address in a manner to cover the entire district most efficiently. Those that have signed up will be notified of their scheduled chipping date.

As in previous years, you will have 2 chipping options:

- · Chips removed from property
- Chips broadcast on property

There are several guidelines that must be followed to ensure chipping crews will collect your slash piles:

- Piles are within 5x5 size limit, neatly stacked with ends facing road
- No more than 15 piles per sign-up
- Piles within 5 feet of roadway
- Piles free of dirt, rocks, root wads, rope, wire, or any other debris

Due to our previous participation, 2021 chipping program registration is open to Elk Falls Ranch residents **now.** The general public will start signing up on April 1.

Roads Report

As spring approaches, the days are getting longer and the sun feels a little warmer, but we probably have a little more winter coming before we can stow the snow shovels. The EFPOA board is planning road maintenance activities for the year.

Projects under consideration include spring and fall grading, more road base additions and widening of Upper Ranch Drive. The road base that was applied last year to Juniper Road and Circle Drive has greatly improved those road surfaces, so we're looking at

adding road base to more roads. We'll also be working on smaller, jobs such as culvert maintenance, ditch maintenance and spot road maintenance as needed.

We haven't had much moisture in the last year, but it doesn't take much to start causing erosion problems. So we'll be on the lookout for drainage/erosion problems. The objective is to make incremental improvements while performing periodic maintenance to slow or prevent deterioration of the road surfaces.



Please let me know if you see a road problem or have a suggestion for improving the roads.

Garbage Kills Bears

The bears will be waking up soon and will be very hungry after winter hibernation.

Allowing bears to use trash and garbage as a food source creates serious problems for both people and bears. Because the food reward is so great,

bears are willing to work hard to get at trash and garbage, and return often in hopes of finding more. These food-conditioned bears sometimes enter homes, garages or even vehicles in search of an easy meal.

Bears in pursuit of such a good source of calories can do a lot of property damage, and even become aggressive. Allowing bears to get into the garbage is one of the leading causes of human- bear conflicts. In addition to a big mess from tipped trash cans, bears that become aggressive in their pursuit of an easy meal must often be destroyed.

Being smart about how you handle and store your trash can protect your home and property, and help keep bears alive and wild.

Mountain Lions Where there's deer, there's mountain lions.

The two lions in this photo are frequent visitors to the Lehmkuhl property at 11820 Northwest Court. It's pretty fun to see these photos, but it's also a good reminder to be careful.

In a recent article in the Park County Flume, the author mentions that mountain lions are becoming

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more habituated and are less intimidated by humans. While their favorite diet is deer, they

take advantage of easier prey such as a dog, goat or child. The article describes a recent killing of a beloved chocolate lab and an attack on a young boy.

Prevention is also discussed in the Article. A couple of examples:

- 1. Make lots of noise if you are outside from dusk to dawn.
- 2. If you encounter a mountain lion, do not run. Maintain eye contact and speak calmly and firmly to the mountain lion.
