Our annual Firewise certification recognizes residents' dedication to preventing and minimizing wildfire destruction around your home, on your property and throughout the neighborhood, and gains us national recognition as a Firewise Prepared Community. If you have not already done so, please report the hours and dollars you have spent over the past 12 months to the Firewise Committee. The easiest way to do so is via an email to elkfallsfirewise@gmail.com. Please provide this information by Tuesday November 15th to ensure that we can compile and submit on time.

The Firewise Committee is also seeking resident sign-up for neighborhood programs for which you may have interest:

- Chipping Program: Participation in the Elk Creek FPD sponsored chipping program was nearly impossible this year due to overwhelming public interest. The public sign-up closed as full within two days of being opened up and without sufficient time for a newsletter notification to get distributed. If you have slash piles to be chipped and were not among the lucky few that were able to sign-up for an ECFPD chipping visit, the Firewise Committee will look into alternate arrangements for neighborhood slash pile chipping. - Need Help with Mitigation?: We recognize that some residents may have the
 desire to do wildfire mitigation work on their property, but may require assistance
 due to physical limitations. The Firewise Committee will assist in matching work
 projects for those in need to energetic and able-bodied volunteers in the
